

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B. 1842 The workhouse was once whitewashed to help paupers from the surrounding villages find the building, it also had a children's brass band and was used as a prison for Italians in WW2.

### Drumalis House




Owned by the Sisters of the Cross and Passion. B. 1872 by Sir Hugh Smiley, on the grounds of an ancient priory. The interior was designed by the Scottish architect George Walton. The house also played a major role Gun Running of 1914. (As the house is now used as a silent retreat, permission for the grounds can be obtained by contacting 028 28272196).



### Larne Museum & Arts Centre

B. 1905 Originally a Library the money for the building was donated by Scottish-American industrialist Andrew Carnegie.




### Town Hall

Built in the French Gothic style in 1870, and paid for by benefactor Charles McGarel.



### Chainé Memorial Tower


E. 1888 to honour Sir James Chainé, who died in 1885. The round tower was once used as a lighthouse. From here, you can also see the Maidens lighthouses and Ferris lighthouse on Island Magee.



### St. Cedma's

One of the oldest churches in Ireland. The church was listed in papal taxation records of 1306 and was used as a place of refuge for Protestants in the rebellion 1641. In the north wall is 'Leper's squint' — lepers had to listen to the service from outside.

### Olderfleet Castle




The remains of a towerhouse dating from approx 1612. The name 'Olderfleet' comes from the viking name for Larne lough - 'Ulfrecksfiord'. It is likely there was a Viking castle in the same spot built approx 950.


**Barbican Gate**
